All documents are exempt from public records disclosure unless and until the complaint is dismissed, probable cause is found, or you request in writing that the information be released.

The May 2nd proceeding will be in executive session and closed to the public unless you request otherwise in writing. You have an opportunity, in accordance with the procedures as set forth in the Commission on Ethics Rules of Procedure, to file a written response to the advocate's recommendation prior to the probable cause hearing. Any documentary evidence that you wish to provide will also be considered by the COE.

Although each complaint will be dealt with individually, along with the COE Advocate, you will be permitted to make a brief oral statement in the nature of oral argument to the commission, based upon the investigator's reports, your written responses, if any, and the recommendation of the advocate, before the probable cause determination. If the COE finds no probable cause, the complaint will be dismissed. If probable cause is found, the COE will set a final public hearing in the matter. At any time prior to a final public hearing, a negotiated settlement may be entered into upon approval by the COE.

Background

This matter came to the attention of Commission on Ethics staff via a sworn complaint filed by Bart Novak (Complainant), a resident of the Village of Wellington (the Village). The complaint alleges that Darell Bowen (Respondent), former Village Mayor, accepted two tickets from International Polo Club of Palm Beach (IPCPB) to attend the World Dressage Masters event held on February 21, 2011.

Inquiry information

The inquiry revealed that the alleged actions listed in the complaint occurred prior to June 1, 2011, the date in which the Village became subject to the jurisdiction of the Palm Beach County Commission on Ethics. For a complaint to be found legally sufficient the complaint must 1) be in writing and executed on a form prescribed by the commission; 2) allege the elements of a violation within the commission's jurisdiction; 3) be based substantially on personal knowledge of the complainant; and 4) be signed under oath or affirmation by the complaining person.



Background

This matter came to the attention of Commission on Ethics staff via a sworn complaint filed by Bart Novak (Complainant), a resident of the Village of Wellington (the Village). The complaint alleges that Darell Bowen (Respondent), former Village Mayor, accepted two tickets from International Polo Club of Palm Beach (IPCPB) to attend the World Dressage Masters event held on February 21, 2011. According to the Complainant, the tickets were valued at \$225 each; however, the Village paid \$80 per ticket according to an invoice addressed to the Respondent and submitted as an attachment to the complaint. All employees and elected/appointed officials of the Village were subject to the jurisdiction of the Commission on Ethics as of June 1, 2011.

Inquiry

On March 19, 2013, I was assigned this complaint for follow-up. I reviewed the information contained in the file in its entirety. My initial review of the documentation contained in the file revealed that the alleged actions listed in the complaint occurred prior to June 1, 2011, the date in which the Village became subject to the jurisdiction of the Palm Beach County Commission on Ethics. For a complaint to be found legally sufficient the complaint must 1) be in writing and executed on a form prescribed by the commission; 2) allege the elements of a violation within the commission's jurisdiction; 3) be based substantially on personal knowledge of the complainant; and 4) be signed under oath or affirmation by the complaining person. Based on the information provided in the complaint, Respondent accepted tickets to attend the World Dressage Masters event in February, 2011, more than three months before Respondent was subject to the Commission's jurisdiction. Based on this information, the Complaint is not legally sufficient.

MEMORANDUM OF NO LEGAL SUFFICIENCY AND RECOMMENDATION OF DISMISSAL

Recommendation

Regarding the Complaint against Respondent, Darell Bowen, former Mayor of the Village of Wellington, the Interim Executive Director, Megan C. Rogers, has found **NO LEGAL SUFFICIENCY** in complaint number C13-008 and recommends **DISMISSAL** pursuant to Art. V, §2-260(b) and Rule of Procedure 4.2.

Legal sufficiency exists where there is an allegation containing the elements of a violation of an ordinance within the jurisdiction of the Ethics Commission, purportedly committed by an individual within the authority of the Ethics Commission, based substantially on the personal knowledge of the Complainant, relating to an alleged violation occurring after the effective date of the code, and filed with the Ethics Commission within two years of the alleged violation.

Background

This matter came to the attention of Commission on Ethics staff via a sworn complaint filed by Bart Novak (Complainant), a resident of the Village of Wellington (the Village). The complaint alleges that Darell Bowen (Respondent), former Village Mayor, accepted two tickets from International Polo Club of Palm Beach (IPCPB) to attend the World Dressage Masters event held on February 21, 2011. According to the Complainant, the tickets were valued at \$225 each; however, the Village paid \$80 per ticket according to an invoice addressed to the Respondent and submitted as an attachment to the complaint. All employees and elected/appointed officials of the Village were subject to the jurisdiction of the Commission on Ethics as of June 1, 2011.

Inquiry and Analysis

For a complaint to be found legally sufficient the complaint must 1) be in writing and executed on a form prescribed by the commission; 2) allege the elements of a violation within the commission's jurisdiction; 3) be based substantially on personal knowledge of the complainant; and 4) be signed under oath or affirmation by the complaining person. Based on the information provided in the complaint, Respondent accepted tickets to attend the World Dressage Masters event in February 2011, more than three months before Respondent was subject to the Commission's jurisdiction.

Conclusion

Based on the fact that the allegations provided in the Complaint, even if true, do not allege a violation of any provision of the Palm Beach County Code of Ethics, and the COE Inquiry did not find any evidence of such a violation, there is **NO LEGAL SUFFICIENCY** to open a formal investigation into this matter.
